We are really excited to share with you a few more details about our plans to celebrate Tirlebrook's 50th birthday on Saturday, 1st October. Taking place between 2 p.m. and 6 p.m., the theme of our event is 'Through the Decades' and we intend to mark our school's birthday by revisiting the 70s, 80s, 90s, 00s, 10s and 20s through which it has stood at the centre of our community. We hope that it will be a day when Tirlebrookers old and new - pupils, parents and staff - can spend time **together** and **explore** the school that was and is such a huge part of their everyday lives. Tirlebrook's Stories

One of our ambitions is to bring the history of Tirlebrook to life through former and current Tirlebrookers 'sharing their stories'. One classroom will be devoted to Tirlebrook's past, with photos and memorabilia on display. As part of this, we are hoping to gather audio recollections from anyone and everyone who would like to contribute. Perhaps you're a former pupil who remembers Mr. Holley or being taught in the bays of our once open plan school? Maybe you've been on a residential trip with Mr. Goodger or visited London for the day on the train? Perhaps you are a current Tirlebrook school community member and you

have a favourite memory you would like to share? This is an ambitious plan, but we want to gather Tirlebrook's stories to share. So, on *Wednesday 7th September*, we are opening our doors from **10** *a.m. to* **8** *p.m.* to anyone with a Tirlebrook connection to pop in and record a memory. It won't take long and there is no pressure, but we'd love to hear from you!

Birthday Bake Off

You will also have noticed that we will be encouraging people to bake a birthday cake to celebrate Tirlebrook's 50th! More details about how this will work will circulate in September, but to whet your appetite, we would love children and adults to use their imaginations to bake a showstopper inspired by the school's anniversary, and bring it along to be shared on the day! We also hope to auction a few bakes to raise a few pennies for the school.

Tirlebrook is 50 Sponsorship Challenge

Also, to commemorate this very special occasion, this summer holiday, we are asking the children (and families if they so wish) to undertake a sponsorship challenge of their choosing to raise funds for the school. *The theme is 50*. It could be absolutely anything linked to 50: performing 50 star jumps a day, reading for 50 minutes each day,

doing 50 handstands in a row or going for 50 short runs. *Did you know that there are exactly 50 days (not including weekends) between the end of this term and our Tirlebrook 50th Birthday celebration on Saturday 1st October?* That seems a strange coincidence to me! 
Coming Up

YR - Y5 Transition Afternoon - Monday 11th July

This coming Monday, the children in Years R to 5 will spend part of the afternoon with their new class teachers in readiness for September. To help them prepare for this, we will be introducing the children to their new teachers in assembly on Monday morning and will follow this up by providing time with their current class teachers afterwards to talk positively about the children's next steps. We will remind the children that all staff at Tirlebrook are kind, supportive, caring and helpful and that teachers are really excited to get to know their new classes. Key Stage One teaching partners will move with their classes for the afternoon to support any nerves or last minute wobbles. We know that many children will be sad to say goodbye to their current teachers and teaching partners and that coping with change can be a challenge. As always, we will support the children throughout this process with sensitivity.

Transition - Coping With Change

As stated above, coping with change can be a challenge. We have all experienced this on a large scale over the past three years and no one has been affected more that the children of the current generation. Some continue to face great change in their lives, relating to home, family, school and friends. The upcoming transition may appear small in the grand scheme of things, but all the same it is a change and some children will cope better with this than others. We hope that you find the poster below helpful for some tips on how to help your child manage any sort of change, with transition to a new year group, a new teacher and in some cases a new school in particular in mind. Some of the advice is particularly appropriate for those moving on to secondary school. In summary:



Choose health \geq

Know what affects your child. What makes them grumpy? Hyper? Disconnected? Do they need snacks, sleep, to get out and about, some time alone? Trust that you know your child and give them the basics they need to cope with difficult days.

\triangleright Be the anchor

In times of change you are: constant, family, familiar, routine, comforting, home

\triangleright Communicate

The small things you do make a difference! Keep talking, listening, hearing, hugging, smiling, reassuring, checking, sharing, suggesting, encouraging, respecting \triangleright Be wise

As they discover things, try to: be interested, guide, give boundaries, see it from all sides, listen to their point of view, choose your words carefully

Have fun \geq

Provide lots of light relief! Do stuff together, be outside, make things, play games, laugh together \triangleright

Be calm

Try to stay calm if your child is feeling distressed. Change may lead to your child showing: highs and lows, melodrama, self-centredness, anger, blame

\triangleright Move on up

Encourage independence. Help them to move positively onto the next stage, increase their responsibilities, be positive and promote their good behaviour. Be aware of your child's changing needs - sometimes it might feel like one step forwards, two steps back

\triangleright Get learning (as age appropriate -

particularly for secondary transition) Be involved, find out more and talk about: social media, internet benefits and dangers, new music, language and slang, current affairs, what it's like to be young in the current world

Look after yourself

Support yourself to best support your child. Lean on friends, offload on other family members, find 'the time', relax, exercise, sleep well, eat well, remember tomorrow is a new day



Tewkesbury Medieval Festival Parade - Sunday 10th July

Years 4 and 5 have been invited to participate in the *Medieval Festival Parade* on *Sunday 10th July*. We will be showcasing the fantastic 'Green Man' sculpture that Silver Birch and Rowan classes created with local artist, Alison Cockcroft, at the beginning of June. We have spoken to the children a number of times about the parade and have clarified with families who will be coming along.

We will be bringing along 'Green Man' style tabards on the morning for the children who made them on Monday 4th July to wear. Families will need to supplement their costume by providing green/brown trousers/leggings/T-shirts to wear underneath these in the parade. Children who did not make a Green Man style tabard (those who signed up to join the parade later) will need to come along wearing a medieval costume of their own choice. An oversized white t-shirt, slashed at the front, laced up and worn with a belt

is an easy outfit idea if you're stuck, or for Y5 children, wearing the costume they prepared for the Medieval Festival visit on 8th July will be perfect! It is important that children do wear a medieval costume or they will not be allowed to join the parade (by instruction of the organisers).

Children need to be brought to Spring Gardens car park (the site of the former Cascades swimming pool) for **10:30** *a.m.* on the morning of Sunday 10th July where they will be met by school staff. The parade

will start from Quay Street at 11:15 a.m. and make its way slowly down the High Street, round the Cross, along Church Street, and past the Abbey, ending at the top end of the Vineyards opposite Lower Lode Lane. Families are welcome to join us in the parade (if in costume) or can follow the Parade (behind the Paramedic Vehicle). Before and during the parade, children must remain with the Tirlebrook group, under direct teacher supervision. Children will need to be picked up at **12:15 p.m.** from the top end of The Vineyards next to Gloucester Road (opposite Lower Lode Lane).

The weather is likely to be extremely hot, so please ensure your child is wearing suncream as well as as thin layers as possible as costumes allow. Please bring a drink for your child to consume at The Vineyards following the parade; in previous years, bottles of water have been distributed by the organisers but, for environmental reasons, this will not be happening this year. It will be very busy, so please allow plenty of time if you need to find a parking space.

Tirlebrook has enjoyed taking part in the parade for many years and it really is a fun and memorable community event for the children. If you can make it out on Sunday to watch, we know it will be an incredible spectacle, and we look forward to seeing you there!

Information for Families

School Dinners

Please try to book school meals, Breakfast Club spaces and Tirlebrookers After-School Club slots for the first week back at school *before returning in September*. It is so easy to forget to do this over the summer holidays and this often causes issues at the beginning of the new academic year. We would be really grateful if you could book things up in advance to help ease the pressure on our catering team and office staff. Please be aware that until the year groups 'roll up' on our SCOPAY system,

your child will still be showing in their current year group. However, this does not affect the booking process and booking ahead really does help us. Please remember that school dinners continue to be free for infants. However, meal choices still need to be made in advance. Importantly, if your child is currently in Y2, school meals must be paid for when



they return to school in Y3. Dinners should be paid for at least 7 days in advance. Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF) and Holiday Activities Programme (HAP) - Summer Break Activity Information

From 1st August to 26th August, eligible children and young people in Gloucestershire will be able to take part in exciting and fun activities across the county in the Holiday Activity and Food programme (HAF). Gloucestershire County Council have once more extended the provision of this programme to all families through their Holiday Activities Programme (HAP). Bookings for activities will open from 11th July. To take full advantage of this, make sure you have your Children's Activity Booking System (CABS) account ready by following the link: <u>https://gloucestershire.gov.uk/haf</u> where you can stay up to date with the latest news about Gloucestershire County Council's offer.

Food Hamper Information

The Holiday Activity and Food programme (HAF), which, as stated above, runs from 1st August to 26th August, also provides families eligible for benefits related Free School Meals (FSM) with the opportunity to book and receive two weeks' of food hampers. These hampers are being provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of its commitment to ensuring that 'no child goes hungry'. If you are currently receiving vouchers from the Holiday Free School Meal voucher scheme, you are eligible to receive food hampers too. As well as the hampers, delicious and nutritious food will be available at all HAF activity sites for children to enjoy. This year, food hamper bookings are being released in waves according to district to ensure as many eligible families as possible have the opportunity to book a food hamper. If you live in Tewkesbury, you will be able to book your food hampers from 11th July until 29th July. Y3 Visit to Pitt Rivers Museum, Oxford - Friday 8th July Mr. Crouch writes,

'What a tremendous day we enjoyed in the sweltering weather! On Friday 8th July, Year 3 visited the Pitt Rivers Museum. This quaint exhibit is home to a vast number of artefacts and is endorsed by Oxford University. The children arrived in Oxford and firstly enjoyed a brief playtime in the Universities Park, which also featured a game of cricket between Oxford and Cambridge universities!

After this, the children walked to the Natural History Museum at Oxford University. After a brief look at the fossils and animal bones, the children entered the Pitt Rivers Museum. The children asked a whole host of questions and staff at the museum answered brilliantly enabling us all to delve deeper into the past. After his terrible battle with Coronavirus (COVID-19) in 2020 and 2021, Tirlebrook parent Mike Burrows, who is still recovering from the disease that ravaged his body, is raising money to say thank you to the NHS, and in particular, the individual doctors and nurses who cared for him throughout his illness and nursed him back to health. He writes,

'As some of you are aware, in November 2020 I contracted Coronavirus (COVID-19) during a hospital visit, which turned into a much longer stay than expected. After a month long Induced Coma trying to survive Covid and a few extra serious complications thrown at me to put my body to its ultimate test of survival, thankfully I started waking up in time to be known as their Christmas miracle. I was told the physical and mental rehabilitation would be a long and challenging path. Being as determined as ever, I have decided to take a long path up to the top of Mount Snowdon with my good friends Ally, Jimbo and Shane as support. This walk is to raise money for all of the **OUTSTANDING** NHS workers that believed in me, stuck with me, and have been through some of the most traumatic times in their own lives battling the Covid pandemic to save others. All money raised will go directly to them as a personal gesture for

self care, which I am sure we can all agree is the least they deserve! Any donation would be appreciated, whether it be a penny or a pound. Thank you to everyone who has supported my family and I through this ordeal, and thank you for taking the time to read this and for any kind donations made. Best wishes!'
