Coming Up

Health & Wellbeing Week - Monday 27th June - Friday 1st July

There is a huge amount happening next week as *Health and Wellbeing Week* returns, culminating in our whole school community *Sports Day* on Friday. Mrs. Featonby has worked tirelessly alongside the teachers to put together an array of fantastic opportunities for the children that promote physical and mental health and wellbeing. We are hoping that the children will not just see the experiences of the week as a one-off, but will be inspired to introduce some aspects into their daily lives. Mrs. Featonby writes,

'We are so excited to announce that next week, beginning Monday 27th June, we will be launching into our annual Health and Wellbeing Week! I would like to give you some key information to prepare for the very busy week that lies ahead:

Monday: children will be reintroduced to our Health and Wellbeing values that we remember under the acronym L.A.C.E.S (Learn, Activate, Connect, Evaluate & Enjoy and Share). The children will be using the values to create a cartoon character/mascot to represent one of the letters.

Tuesday: please come to school wearing **PINK!** It is a dress-down day and we would be grateful if you would exchange the opportunity for your child to wear **pink** to school with a donation to



my **Coppatrek** charity fundraiser. Contributions are of course voluntary, but there will be buckets at the gate at the beginning and end of the day for any donations to be collected. Hopefully you will have seen in the newsletter that I am fundraising to raise breast cancer awareness and will be completing a trek through the Sahara Desert in the Autumn Term. Children are invited to wear **pink** clothing - shoes, socks, headwear, hair paint and accessories or even a bright, pink tutu! During the

morning, Sports Council will be assisting me by setting up an obstacle fun run around the Tirlebrook playground and Tirlebrook 10 track.

The aim is for each junior class to achieve 100 km (the length of my Sahara Trek) and for the infant children, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 - to achieve 100 km collectively. There are many other activities happening on Tuesday too, including **Relax Kids** workshops and some of our junior classes will be introduced to the wacky world of **Omnikin**!



Wednesday and **Thursday**: PE kits will be required as different groups of children join in with **cricket** and **martial arts** workshops. Our Year 2, Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5 children will also be continuing their healthy food workshops with Chef Caldera.

Friday: it's **SPORTS DAY!** Children should come to school wearing plain black shorts and a t-shirt in the colour of their house team (Hastings - yellow, Beauchamp - red, Wenlock - blue, Montague - green). The day will involve a sports quiz, sports day games and races. And of course, there is the whole school lunch and community Tirlebrook 10 to look forward to! Health and Wellbeing Week - PE Kits

For the entire week, we strongly suggest that your child comes to school with a sun hat, plenty to drink (a refillable water bottle) and that they have applied sun cream each morning. Don't forget to dress in pink on Tuesday and PE kits will be needed on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, as well as for your child's regular PE day. This is important to remember for our Junior children who need to come to school wearing their PE kit. A group of 24 children have been improving their cycling skills as they have completed the Level 2 Bikability course. Tewkesbury Primary Schools' Athletics Championships - Tuesday 21st June Mrs. Featonby writes,

'In the sizzling heat on midsummer's Tuesday evening, a large group of our junior children competed in the annual **Tewkesbury Primary Schools' Athletics Championships** at Tewkebsury School. Despite this being an annual event, this was the first time since 2018 that this event has managed to go ahead, due to weather postponements and Coronavirus (COVID-19). We were so excited to return to the track and to compete with all of our other local schools again.

With Mr Lockley on the mic and a team of supportive Tirlebrook staff in the box, the children gathered to compete both as individuals and as a team. The night kicked off with the Year 5 and Year 6 sprints which were extremely competitive! Despite this, **Isaac C** managed to achieve a **bronze** medal, coming 3rd in his sprint race, performing excellently against a group of 10 competitors! The Year 3 and Year 4 sprints followed, with yet another **bronze** for **Jack R** and a **silver** medal for **Henry S**.

Tirlebrook seemed to get stronger and stronger as the night progressed: **Scarlet O** and **Alex C** picked up **bronze** and **silver** medals respectively in the 200m sprints. And we did

not stop there! The **Year 4 girls** flew across the finish line in 3rd place, earning themselves a **bronze** medal in the shuttle relay. This was quickly followed by the **Year 4 boys** who absolutely stormed their race, finishing miles ahead of the rest of the field in 1st place, gaining our first gold medal of the evening for Tirlebrook. The **Year 3 girls** ran superbly, positively and worked brilliantly as a team, and despite not picking up a medal, should be very proud of their performance. We are particularly proud of **Elodie** for stepping up in to the race at the last minute. The **Year 3 boys** worked excellently together too and achieved a well deserved **bronze** medal.

In the toughest event of the competition, the 1000m, not just because of the distance but also because of the punishing heat, **Sami B** and **Georgie C** both performed heroically and gained **bronze** medals. Well done to you both! The 600m sprints were next. **Erin G** and **Stan M**, two of our younger sensational runners, ran exceptionally! Erin worked incredibly hard to secure her **silver** medal and Stan took the fight to the field from the off, leading from start to finish to secure his gold medal! We were simply in awe of their performances.

It was then time for the baton relays. The **Year 5 girls** worked well together, passing the baton well and smiling as they finished, despite not placing. The **boys in Year 5** performed well, but had a mixed race, moving from third, to fourth, back into third then first, but were run out of the medals in an extremely fast and tight finishing 100 metres. I am sure that next year, you will come back even stronger! The **Year 6 girls** relay was great to watch and the girls really tried hard with their handovers and it was definitely clear that they had a strong, athletic team. The **Year 6 boys** were the next to receive a medal, finishing in 3rd place and gaining **bronze**!









And that was just on the track! Tirlebrook quite clearly have great talent in the field events. Sami B, Jack R, Betsy W and Thumelo K all received gold medals, coming first in their field event (throwing or jumping). Hayden M received a bronze medal for her jumping performance too. Track and field events combined to contribute to Tirlebrook's final score and overall performance. We also had many, many 4th place finishes, all of which earned a great number of points for our team, with many children just missing out on a medal, including: Riley C, Stan M, Theo L, Layla H and Isaac C.

The competition was fierce and very competitive. This year, it was Carrant Brook who finished on top. The John Moore finished in 2nd place, just a couple of points ahead of **Tirlebrook**, finishing in a very respectable 3rd place. We also came joint 1st in the field events competition alongside Carrant Brook. We must remember to get that trophy from them to display in 6 months' time!

Well done to every single child who participated. We are so extremely proud of you all! Winners, or not, you all represented our school superbly and we hope you enjoyed the occasion. Thank you too to all of the staff who came along to organise the team, lead the event, provide first aid, help hand out medals and even put up a gazebo - so huge thanks to **Mr. Lockley**, **Mr. Crouch**, **Miss. Moysey**, **Mrs. Durrant**, **Mrs. Moysey** and **Miss. Stoker**! And thank you also to all of the parents and families who came to support. It was wonderful to see you all and I know that the children were thrilled to be back competing with their families able to spectate. **Well done Tirlebrook!**'

And very well done *Mrs. Featonby* for organising and coordinating Tirlebrook's entry into this year's competition, including all the training and practice that happened beforehand. For those of you who didn't see Mrs. Featonby, she was busy collating the scores for the Large Schools' Competition. Information for the children taking part:

Children attending the parade will be making a Green Man style tabard in school for their costume on Monday 4th July. <u>Families will need to supplement their costume by providing green/brown</u> trousers/leggings/T-shirts to wear underneath these in the parade.



Children will need to be brought to Spring Gardens car park (the site of the former Cascades swimming pool) for 10:30 a.m. on the morning of Sunday 10th July where they will be met by school staff.

The parade will start from Quay Street at 11:15 a.m. and make its way slowly down the High Street, round the Cross, along Church Street, past the Abbey ending at the top end of the Vineyards opposite Lower Lode Lane. Families are welcome to join us in the parade (if in costume) or can follow the parade (behind the paramedic vehicle).
